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About ISAT

ISAT is a 3-hour online multiple-choice test designed to assess a candidate's intellectual skills and abilities that are the foundation of academic success at tertiary level. The test is independently developed by the Australian Council for Educational Research (ACER). ACER has an excellent international reputation and track record in the development, management and research of selection tests for undergraduate medical and health related programs. ISAT is administered as a remote proctored test via Prometric's branch, ProProctor.

Structure and content of ISAT

The ISAT is a 3 hour online multiple choice test. The test is presented in units, with stimulus material followed by questions. There are 100 questions with 4 or 5 answers from which the candidate is asked to choose the most appropriate response. There is only one correct answer, with no marks deducted for incorrect answers. ISAT is not a test of subject specific knowledge. Rather, it aims to assess a candidate's 'critical' and 'quantitative' reasoning skills.

'Critical Reasoning' (CR) - involves comprehending and analysing information; understanding, applying and extending ideas; drawing appropriate conclusions; and evaluating arguments. These questions use material from the humanities and social sciences.

'Quantitative Reasoning' (QR) - involves analysis and application of information; drawing conclusions and making decisions; and solving problems. These questions use material from the mathematics and sciences.

Sample Questions

The following provides a sample of the types of questions found in the test. Please note, the format of these questions will be appear differently in the actual test, undertaken by remote proctoring.

Figures 1 and 2 provide some information about a model of the relationship between leg length (L , in metres, m), stride length (S , in metres, m) and speed (v , in metres per second, $m\ s^{-1}$) for various animals. For any individual, stride length and speed can vary, but leg length is fixed.

Figure 2 relates *Relative Stride Length* ($\frac{S}{L}$) to a parameter known as the *Froude Number* ($\frac{v}{\sqrt{gL}}$).

In the graph, the line of best fit was obtained by observing a number of individuals from various animal species, travelling at different speeds.

Also shown are three points based on values obtained from individuals of three species – elephants, rhinoceros and camels.

- g is acceleration due to gravity on Earth and is equal to about $10\ m\ s^{-2}$

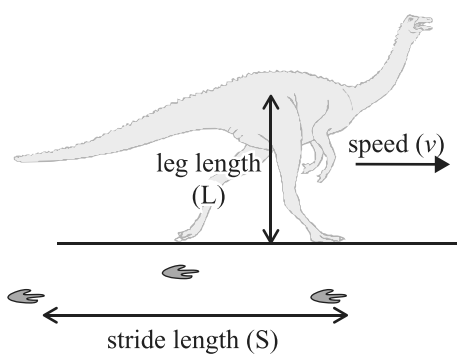

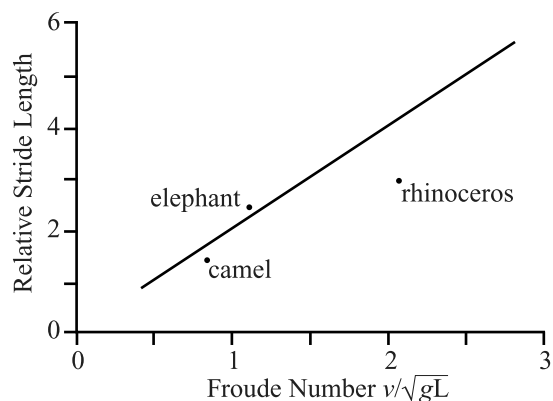

In the 18th century it was discovered that Sanskrit, an ancient language once spoken in India, is related to a range of European languages. The discovery was made by a British scholar working in India, Sir Willam Jones. The passage below discusses Jones's discovery.

Jones noticed many striking similarities between Sanskrit and European languages — the Sanskrit word for birch, for instance, was *bhurja*. The Sanskrit for king, *raja*, is close to the Latin *rex*. The Sanskrit for ten, *dasa*, is reminiscent of the Latin *decem*. And so on. All of these clearly suggested a common historical parentage. Jones looked at other languages and discovered further similarities. In a landmark speech to the Asiatic Society in Calcutta he proposed that many of the classical languages — among them Sanskrit, Greek, Latin, Gothic, Celtic, and Persian — must spring from the same source. This was a bold assertion since nothing in recorded history would encourage such a conclusion, and it excited great interest among scholars all over Europe. The next century saw a feverish effort to track down the parent language, Indo-European, as it was soon called.

ACER ISAT account

All candidates wishing to undertake ISAT must have an ACER ISAT account.

Please see the following page to create an ACER account: <https://registration.acer.edu.au/>

Please ensure that your name and date of birth exactly match the identification document that you will present on the test day. These details will also be printed on your Admission Ticket and Statement of Results. To change the name, date of birth or gender in your account, you will need to email the ISAT Office. It is important that your email address remains valid and has been maintained during the registration, test and reporting cycle. Once an account has been activated it can be used for any future registrations.

Registration dates

The deadline date to register for Cycle 3 is 26 July 2021 (9pm AEST). The deadline date to register for Cycle 4 is 25 October 2021 (9pm AEST).

Payment

The registration fee for ISAT is AUD413. Payment is made to ACER at the time of registration.

Payment must be submitted online by credit card (MasterCard, Visa). The online payment option operates through ACER's e-commerce facility via the ACER website. Credit card details are not recorded or stored by ACER but are encrypted at point of capture and transmitted directly to the bank, without entering ACER information systems.

Candidates will receive a payment confirmation/tax invoice by email once the payment transaction is completed. The credit card statement may list ACER as the recipient, and a specific reference to ISAT may not be mentioned. If the amount charged to the credit card provided to complete the registration is wrongfully disputed, the registration may be cancelled, results may be withheld or the candidate may be blocked from taking further ACER administered tests.

Refund terms

Laws such as the Australian Consumer Law require refunds in certain circumstances. Apart from those circumstances, all moneys paid as part of a registration to sit the ISAT are non-refundable, for example, if you simply change your mind about sitting the ISAT due to personal circumstances.

Registration fees for the ISAT will be refunded without charge if requested prior to the deadline date, or, if requested within two weeks of the date that you register, irrespective of the deadline date to request a refund. After that period an administration charge of \$70 (including GST) will be deducted.

Before the Test

Test centres

The ISAT is conducted via remote proctoring using the ProProctor platform. If candidates are unable to test via remote proctoring due to internet or accessible device issues, they are advised to contact the ISAT office at isat@acer.org.

What is Remote Proctoring?

Remote proctoring involves sitting the test under live supervision using your own computer in a suitable location with internet connectivity. Please read the following ProProctor manual prior to registering: **[CLICK HERE](#)**

The remote proctoring application, computer-based test delivery system, tutorial, test content, and survey are the published, confidential, and proprietary materials or intellectual property of Prometric and ACER. Communicating, publishing, reproducing, or transmitting any part of the test, in any form or by any means (e.g. verbal, electronic, written, etc.) for any purpose is strictly prohibited. ANY reproduction or disclosure will result in immediate notification to ACER with further investigation and consequences including but not limited to:

- cancelling registration to sit ISAT without any refund;
- withholding of ISAT results;
- disqualification from undertaking ISAT:
- for a period of time; or
- at all.

Applying for Reasonable Adjustments

Candidates who have a disability or other health-related needs which might interfere with their ability to sit the test in the standard manner are advised to apply for reasonable adjustments through their online account as soon as possible after registration. All such requests must be submitted by no later than the deadline date to register for that cycle. For conditions that occurred after the application deadline, please contact the ISAT Office for advice.

Candidates must submit the online form and supporting documentation for their request through their online account. The supporting documentation must be from a registered health practitioner and must give a clear diagnosis and information on the condition, indicate the impact of the condition in testing settings and include a statement as to what accommodations the health practitioner feels are appropriate for the candidate in testing settings. All supporting documentation must be typed on the health practitioner's official letterhead and include the date and title, name, registration number, contact details, and signature of the medical practitioner. The documentation must be no more than one year old for health-related needs or disabilities other than learning disabilities, and no more than five years old for learning disabilities.

If your report is more than five years old, it will still be accepted, as long as it is accompanied by a recent letter from a psychologist stating that the information in the report is still applicable to you as you are today.

Admission Ticket

You will receive an email from the ISAT office advising once your admission ticket has been released. You will need to log into your ACER account to access your ticket.

This ticket is your permission to sit the test by remote proctoring. You should check your Admission Ticket carefully and contact the ISAT Office immediately if there are any errors. The details on the Admission Ticket must match the details on the identification document that you will use on the test day. Only your first and last names are required to match and it is not necessary for other names (including middle names) to appear on the Admission Ticket.

You must have a copy of your Admission Ticket saved to your desktop on the test day as you will be required to show it to your proctor.

If you have issues accessing your Admission Ticket, you should contact the ISAT Office prior to the day of your test. Please do not leave this to the last minute.

Preparing for ISAT

This section will guide you through the steps you will need to complete in order to sit ISAT via remote proctoring. There are seven test preparation tasks in total and completing each one is essential to a successful test day experience.

Step by Step Guide

Step 1: Read the ProProctor User Guide

Candidates are required to read the [ProProctor User Guide](#) prior to registering for ISAT.

Step 2: Complete a System Readiness Check with ProProctor

Before you finalise your ISAT registration you should complete a [System Readiness Check](#). This check confirms whether your computer can install and run the ProProctor application so that you can sit the test successfully.

Network firewalls at public locations, such as your place of work, a university or a library, are likely to prevent access to ProProctor and the automatic equipment test may not detect the firewalls. **It is advised that you sit the test using a personal device connected to your home network.** A desktop device with a webcam will usually be a superior option to a laptop.

PLEASE NOTE: 1024 x 768 is the minimum screen resolution required to avoid issues with pop-up boxes during testing.

It is important that you complete the equipment test using the computer with which you plan to sit the test AND at the location where you will sit the test, and connect to a live technician to do a full equipment check.

Step 3 : Create an ACER account and register for ISAT

Log in to your ACER ISAT account or create one here: <https://registration.acer.edu.au/>. You will then need to successfully register for the ISAT via your ACER account.

Step 4: Register through the ProProctor Scheduling System

Once you have registered for ISAT via your ACER account, you will be taken to a page where you can select "Schedule remote proctored sitting", you will be redirected to the Prometric registration system where you can then select the date and time of your preferred remote proctored sitting.

Step 5: Download and install the ProProctor application

Once your computer has been validated through the system readiness check and you have successfully registered for ISAT, you are ready to download and install the ProProctor application that delivers your test. Follow the instructions provided on the following page: [ProProctor Application Download](#)

You must install the application on the computer that you intend to sit the test with.

PLEASE NOTE: You will not be able to run the ProProctor application until you have registered for ISAT and have a confirmation number. The testing app will run at the time of your scheduled remote proctored sitting.

Step 6: Admission Ticket

Log in to your ACER ISAT account to access your Admission Ticket. Ensure that information on your ticket is correct prior to your test sitting. If any information is incorrect, you will need to contact the ISAT office with enough time for the information to be updated within your account. ISAT admission tickets will be available through your ACER online account approximately two weeks prior to your test sitting. You will receive an email from the ISAT office when your admission ticket is ready.

Step 7: Sit ISAT at your scheduled time

On the Test Day

Items needed for your test session

- Candidates are required to bring the following to their test sitting:
 1. Confirmation of registration email. Please have this saved to your desktop ready to show the Proctor.
 2. One form of non-expired, government-issued, photo- and signature-bearing ID (If the identification you present does not contain a photograph of you, as you look on the test day, you will not be allowed to sit ISAT). Ensure that the names on your ID are displayed the same way they are displayed on your test record, and that the IDs have a current signature.
 3. Your ProProctor Confirmation Number (this can be found on the dashboard of your ISAT registration).
 4. Two (2) A4 pieces of blank scrap paper and two (2) pens.
- Candidates whose native language is not English may bring a printed bilingual dictionary into the test. Dictionaries must not contain definitions of English words in English. The pages must be unmarked and all notes removed. Any candidate taking this option must submit the dictionary to the Supervisor for inspection before the test begins. Candidates should note that electronic dictionaries are not permitted.
- No calculators, food and drink, smart watches, smart glasses, books, notes, mobile phones, pencil cases or dictionaries other than stated above are permitted.

Test Session Issues

Should you wish to query a particular test question on the day of the test, please alert your proctor of your concern. If the proctor is unable to assist you or you have not yet been connected with a Proctor and are experiencing issues, please click on the [Contact Support](#) button on the top of the ProProctor Candidate Portal.

Misconduct

ISAT is a high stakes test; that is, the results of the test have the potential to make a major impact on the future international study plans of the candidate. For this reason, ACER has established security procedures which will be strictly enforced at all times.

It is the responsibility of candidates to ensure that they understand that the following are considered to be breaches of test rules:

- the giving of false or misleading information during the registration process
- attempting to gain access to test questions prior to the test
- attempting to gain unauthorised access to or copy the test or administration processes in the test room
- attempting to take the test on behalf of another person
- allowing another person to attempt to take the test on your behalf
- attempting to remove any notes from the testing room
- failure to follow test supervisor's instructions at all times
- giving or receiving assistance during the test
- creating a disturbance
- using unauthorised aids (including but not limited to notes, note paper, calculator, mobile phone, recording device, smart devices, accessing the internet etc.)

The penalty for any of the above breaches will be the cancellation of the candidate's test and a ban from registering to sit for ISAT on future occasion.

After the Test

ISAT results

ISAT 2021 results will be released within two weeks of the test sitting. You will receive an email from the ISAT Office when your results become available. Your results will then be accessible via your ACER account.

A Statement of Results will be generated and you should print and save it for your records. The ISAT Office does not issue physical certified hardcopy of your results.

As an applicant to a university, it is your responsibility to supply the university with your ISAT ID and your ISAT results.

At the time of registering for your ISAT sitting, you should nominate which university/universities can access your ISAT results for the purposes of verifying the record you supply to them. If you wish to change the list of nominated universities after you received your results, please contact the ISAT Office.

ISAT 2021 Declaration
